



2019 Adaptive Immune Receptor Repertoire (AIRR) Community Meeting IV "Bridging the Gaps"

Dear Colleague,

We are pleased to announce registration for the 2019 AIRR Community (**AIRR-C**) Meeting is open. NOTE: To avoid the higher fee, please register before 15 March.

Agenda

The theme of this meeting, "Bridging the Gaps", addresses:

- technological gaps between the amounts of accumulated data and our ability to process them, and
- the need to engage stakeholder communities (industry, clinicians, patent communities) in working toward universal standards for the generation, analysis, deposition, exploration and sharing of high-throughput AIRR sequencing (**AIRR-seq**) data.

We have confirmed two outstanding Keynote speakers – Dr. Sai Reddy from ETH Zurich and Dr. Antonio Lanzavecchia from IRB Bellinzona. Two planned panel discussions will include representatives from other institutions and companies that work with AIRR-seq data. In addition, two "challenge" sessions are planned to address the above-mentioned gaps. Two pre-meeting workshops will be available to teach the basics of immunology, and of AIRR-seq data analysis for beginners. Also planned are two poster sessions; and two demo sessions (one for tools and one for pipeline tutorials).

The AIRR-C Meeting Committee has organized the 2019 meeting over five days, May 11-15. Here is a link to both brief and full agendas. The first day, Saturday May 11, will focus on Working Group (WG) Meetings, Workshops and WG Progress Reports. Sunday May 12 will focus on Working Group and Communication Subcommittee Progress Reports as well as the Welcome Reception. Monday May 13 and Tuesday May 14 will focus on Scientific Progress & Challenges in both Basic Science and Clinical Science and Translation. The Annual General Meeting (AGM) of the AIRR-C/TAbS membership is scheduled for the final day, Wednesday May 15. Registration for this meeting will allow you to join TAbS, and thus become a voting member of the AIRR-C, for no additional charge; this will allow you to attend and vote in the 2019 AGM.
